In the New Year would you consider donating your bike?


The Migrant Farm Worker Bike program is involved with the Maple Ridge Multicultural Society, Family Education and Support Centre, St Vincent de Paul, and the Knights of Columbus with a goal of collecting two hundred adult bikes and helmets for the migrant farm workers in the Lower Mainland/Fraser Valley.

The farm workers, both male & female are isolated, and most do not speak English. They require bicycles to travel to work and back and to obtain necessities such as groceries.
